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

പൗരോഹിത്വ ആഡ്വാത്മികത: വചനവിചിന്തനങ്ങൾ

മല്പാൻ മാത്യു വെള്ളാനിക്കൽ

സഭയും പരിശുദ്ധാത്മദാനങ്ങളും

(തിരുവചനഭാഗം: 1 കോറിന്തോസ് 12, 1-31)

സഭയിൽ വിവിധങ്ങളായ ആത്മീയദാനങ്ങളുണ്ട്. അവയെല്ലാം മിശിഹാ യുടെ മഹത്ത്വത്തിനായിരിക്കണമെന്ന് പൗലോസ്ശ്ലീഹാ ഉദ്ബോധിപ്പിക്കുന്നു. ഈ തിരുവചനഭാഗം താഴെക്കാണുംവിധം വിഭജിക്കാം.

- 1. ഈശോ കർത്താവാണെന്ന വിശ്വാസപ്രഖ്യാപനം (12,1-3)
- 2. അരൂപി ഒന്ന്, അനേകം വരങ്ങൾ (12,4-11)
- 3. സഭ: മിശിഹായുടെ ശരീരം (12,12-20)
- 4. ഒരു ശരീരവും പല അവയവങ്ങളും (12,21-26)
- 5. സഭയിലെ വിവിധ ദാനങ്ങൾ (12,27-31)

ഈ വചനഭാഗം അജപാലകർക്കും അജഗണങ്ങൾക്കും നല്കുന്ന സന്ദേശ ങ്ങൾ പഠനവിഷയമാക്കാം.

1. ഈശോ കർത്താവാണെന്ന വിശ്വാസപ്രഖ്യാപനം

"സഹോദരരേ, നിങ്ങൾ ആത്മീയ ദാനങ്ങളെക്കുറിച്ച് അറിവുള്ളവരായിരിക്കണമെന്നു ഞാനാഗ്രഹിക്കുന്നു. നിങ്ങൾ വിജാതീയരായിരുന്നപ്പോൾ സംസാരശേഷിയില്ലാത്ത വിഗ്രഹങ്ങളുടെ അടുത്തേക്ക് അപഥ സഞ്ചാരം ചെയ്തിരുന്നത് ഓർക്കുന്നുണ്ടല്ലോ. ദൈവാത്മാവുമുഖേന സംസാരിക്കുന്നവരാരും ഈശോ ശപിക്കപ്പെട്ടവനാണ് എന്ന് ഒരിക്കലും പറയുകയില്ലെന്നും ഈശോ കർത്താവാണ് എന്നു പറയാൻ പരിശുദ്ധാത്മാവു മുഖേനയല്ലാതെ ആർക്കും സാധിക്കുകയില്ലെന്നും നിങ്ങൾ ഗ്രഹിക്കണമെന്നു ഞാൻ ആഗ്രഹിക്കുന്നു" (12,1-3).

കോറിന്തോസുകാർ പൗലോസ്ഗ്ലീഹായോട് എഴുതിച്ചോദിച്ചിരിക്കാനിടയുള്ള കാര്യങ്ങളിൽ ഒന്ന് 'ഉന്മാദസംസാര'മായിരുന്നു. 'ഗ്ലോസ്സോലലിയ' എന്നു ഗ്രീക്കുഭാ ഷയിൽ പറഞ്ഞിരിക്കുന്ന കാര്യത്തിന് ഇംഗ്ലീഷിലും മലയാളത്തിലും വ്യാഖ്യാനപര മായ സംജ്ഞയാണ് ഉപയോഗിക്കുന്നത്. 'ഭാഷയിൽ സംസാരിക്കുക', 'ഭാഷാവരം' തുടങ്ങിയവയാണ് ഈ പ്രതിഭാസത്തെ കാണിക്കാൻ ഉപയോഗിക്കുന്ന വാക്കുകൾ. 'ഉന്മാദസംസാരം' പല മതങ്ങളിലും പതിവുള്ള കാര്യമാണ്. കോറിന്തോസുകാരുടെ കാര്യത്തിലും അവർ ക്രിസ്തീയവിശ്വാസത്തിലേക്കു വരുന്നതിനുമുമ്പ് ഇത്തരം പ്രതി ഭാസമുണ്ടായിരുന്നതായി ഇവിടെ സൂചനയുണ്ട് (12,2). ആരാധനാവേളകളിൽ ഉന്മാ ദസംസാരം നടത്തി പരിചയമുണ്ടായിരുന്ന കോറിന്തോസുകാർ സഭാംഗങ്ങളായ പ്പോഴും ഈ വഴക്കം തുടർന്നിരുന്നു എന്ന് ന്യായമായും കരുതാം. ഇവിടെ

പൗലോസ്ശ്ലീഹാ വ്യക്തമായ മാനദണ്ഡം നല്കുന്നു.

ഉന്മാദസംസാരം നടത്തുന്നയാൾ ദൈവാരൂപിയാൽ പ്രചോദിതമായാണ് അപ്ര കാരം ചെയ്യുന്നതെങ്കിൽ 'ഈശോ കർത്താവാണ്' എന്ന വിശ്വാസപ്രഖ്യാപനവും ആയിരിക്കുമത്. 'ഈശോ കർത്താവാണ്' എന്നത് ആദിമസഭയുടെ വിശ്വാസപ്ര മാണമായിരുന്നു. ക്രോഡീകരിക്കപ്പെട്ട വിശ്വാസപ്രമാണങ്ങൾ ഉണ്ടാകുന്നതിനു മുമ്പ് ആദിമസഭാംഗങ്ങൾ അവരുടെ വിശ്വാസം പ്രഖ്യാപിച്ചിരുന്നത് ഈ രീതിയി ലായിരുന്നു. ദൈവാരൂപിയാൽ നയിക്കപ്പെടുന്ന ആർക്കും "ഈശോ ശപിക്കപ്പെ ട്ടവൻ" എന്ന് ഉച്ചരിക്കാൻ കഴിയുകയില്ല. "ഈശോ കർത്താവ്" എന്ന് ഏറ്റുപറയു വാൻ ദൈവാരൂപിയില്ലാതെ ആർക്കും സാധ്യവുമല്ല. അതുകൊണ്ട് സഭയുടെ അടി സ്ഥാനപരമായ വിശ്വാസം ഏറ്റുപറയുന്നവർക്ക് ദൈവാരൂപിയുടെ ദാനം ലഭിച്ചി ട്ടുണ്ട് എന്ന് ശ്ലീഹാ വ്യക്തമാക്കുന്നു. ഈശോ ഭരിക്കുന്ന ജീവിതം നയിച്ചുകൊണ്ട് സഭാജീവിതം നയിക്കുവാൻ അജപാലകർ അജഗണങ്ങളെ പ്രചോദിപ്പിക്കണം.

2. അരൂപി ഒന്ന്, അനേകം വരങ്ങൾ

"ദാനങ്ങളിൽ വൈവിധ്യം ഉണ്ടെങ്കിലും ആത്മാവ് ഒന്നുതന്നെ. ശുശ്രൂഷകളിൽ വൈവിധ്യം ഉണ്ടെങ്കിലും കർത്താവ് ഒന്നുതന്നെ. പ്രവൃത്തികളിൽ വൈവിധ്യം ഉണ്ടെങ്കിലും എല്ലാവർക്കും എല്ലാറ്റിലും പ്രചോദനം നൽകുന്ന ദൈവം ഒന്നുതന്നെ. ഓരോരുത്തരിലും ആത്മാവു വെളിപ്പെടുന്നത് പൊതുനന്മയ്ക്കുവേണ്ടിയാണ്. ഒരേ ആത്മാവുതന്നെ ഒരാൾക്കു വിവേകത്തിന്റെ വചനവും മറ്റൊരാൾക്കു ജ്ഞാനത്തിന്റെ വചനവും നൽകുന്നു. ഒരേ ആത്മാവുതന്നെ ഒരുവനു വിശ്വാസവും വേറൊരുവനു രോഗശാന്തിക്കുള്ള വരവും നൽകുന്നു. ഒരുവന് അദ്ഭുതങ്ങൾ പ്രവർത്തിക്കാൻ ശക്തിയും, മറ്റൊരുവനു പ്രവചിക്കാൻ വരവും, വേറൊരുവന് ആത്മാക്കളെ വിവേചിച്ചറിയാൻ കഴിവും വേറൊരുവനു ഭാഷാവരവും, വേറൊരുവന് വ്യാഖ്യാനത്തിനുള്ള വരവും, അതേ ആത്മാവു തന്നെ നൽകുന്നു. തൻറെ ഇച്ഛയ്ക്കൊത്ത് ഓരോരുത്തർക്കും പ്രത്യേക പ്രത്യേക ദാനങ്ങൾ നൽകുന്ന ഒരേ ആത്മാവിന്റെതന്നെ പ്രവൃത്തിയാണ് ഇതെല്ലാം" (12,4-11).

സഭയിൽ പ്രകടമായ വിവിധ ആത്മീയദാനങ്ങളെക്കുറിച്ചാണ് ഇവിടെ ശ്ലീഹാ പ്രതിപാദിക്കുന്നത്. സഭയിലെ വിവിധങ്ങളായ ശുശ്രൂഷകൾക്കും ദാന ങ്ങൾക്കും പിന്നിൽ ഏക ഉറവിടമാണുള്ളത് – ദൈവം. ദാനങ്ങൾ എന്നതിന്റെ മൂലപദം 'കരിസ്മാത്താ' എന്നതാണ്. കൂപയുടെ ഫലമായി ഉളവാകുന്ന ഒന്നാണ് ദാനങ്ങൾ. സഭാസമ്മേളനങ്ങളോടു ബന്ധപ്പെട്ട വിഷയങ്ങളാണ് ഇവിടെ 'ദാനങ്ങൾ', 'പ്രവർത്തനങ്ങൾ', 'ശുശ്രൂഷകൾ' എന്നെല്ലാം അവതരിപ്പിച്ചിരിക്കുന്നത്. ഇവയ്ക്ക് ഒരേയൊരു ഉറവിടം മാത്രമുള്ളതുപോലെതന്നെ ഇവയുടെ ലക്ഷ്യവും ഒന്നുമാത്രമാണ്. ഓരോരുത്തരിലും അരൂപി വെളിപ്പെടുന്നത് പൊതുനന്മയ്ക്കു വേണ്ടിയാണ്. അതായത്, ആരാധനാസമൂഹത്തെ ഒന്നാകെ പടുത്തുയർത്താൻ വേണ്ടിയാണ് ദൈവം ആത്മീയദാനങ്ങൾ നല്കുന്നത്. അവ ഓരോരുത്തരുടെയും വ്യക്തിപരമായ പ്രകടനങ്ങൾക്കും നേട്ടങ്ങൾക്കും വേണ്ടിയുള്ളവയല്ല.

ഏതൊക്കെയാണു വരങ്ങൾ എന്നു പഠിപ്പിക്കാനോ, അവയോരോന്നിന്റെയും പ്രത്യേകതകളും പ്രവർത്തനരീതികളും വിശദീകരിക്കാനോ ലക്ഷ്യമിട്ടുകൊണ്ടല്ല ശ്ലീഹാ ഇക്കാര്യങ്ങൾ രേഖപ്പെടുത്തുന്നത്. എന്തിനാണു വരങ്ങൾ നല്കപ്പെടുന്നത് എന്നും വരങ്ങൾ സഭയിൽ എപ്രകാരമാണ് ഉപയോഗിക്കേണ്ടത് എന്നും പ്രബോധിപ്പിക്കുക മാത്രമാണ് പൗലോസ്ശ്ലീഹായുടെയ ലക്ഷ്യം. ഒരേ ആത്മാവിലൂടെ (12,8), ഒരേ ആത്മാവിനാൽ (12,6), ഒരേ ആത്മാവിനനുസൃതം (12,9) എന്നീ വ്യത്യാ സങ്ങൾ ആത്മീയദാനങ്ങളെ സംബന്ധിച്ച ദൈവശാസ്ത്രത്തിൽ പ്രാധാന്യമർഹിക്കുന്നതാണ്. എല്ലാ ദാനങ്ങളും നല്കുന്നത് ദൈവമാണ് (12,6) എന്നും ഇത് ആത്മാ വിന്റെ പ്രവൃത്തിയാണ് (12,11) എന്നും ഇവിടെ എടുത്തുപറഞ്ഞിരിക്കുന്നു. വരദാനങ്ങൾക്കല്ല, വരങ്ങളെല്ലാം നല്കുന്ന ദൈവത്തിനും, ഏറ്റവും വലിയ ദാനമായ പരി ശുദ്ധാത്മാവിനുമാണ് ശ്ലീഹാ പ്രാധാന്യം കൊടുത്തിരിക്കുന്നത്. സമൂഹാംഗങ്ങൾക്ക് ദൈവം നല്കുന്ന വരദാനങ്ങൾ, സമൂഹത്തെ ഒരു ആരാധനാസമൂഹമായി പടു ത്തുയർത്തുവാനാണെന്നതിനെപ്പറ്റി അജപാലകർ അജഗണങ്ങളെ ബോധവൽക്ക രിക്കണം.

3. സഭ: മിശിഹായുടെ ശരീരം

"ശരീരം ഒന്നാണെങ്കിലും, അതിൽ പല അവയവങ്ങൾ ഉണ്ട്. അവയവങ്ങൾ പലതെങ്കിലും അവയെല്ലാംചേർന്ന് ഏകശരീരമായിരിക്കുന്നു. അതുപോലെതന്നെയാണ് മിശിഹായും. നമ്മളെല്ലാവരും ഒരേ ആത്മാവിൽ ഏകശരീരമാകാൻ മാമോദീസാ സ്വീക രിച്ചു. യഹുദരെന്നോ ഗ്രീക്കുകാരെന്നോ, അടിമകളെന്നോ സ്വതന്ത്രരെന്നോ ഭേദംകൂടാതെ ഒരേ ആത്മാവിനെ പാനം ചെയ്യാൻ എല്ലാവർക്കും സാധിച്ചു. ഒരു അവയവമല്ല, പലതു ചേർന്നതാണ് ശരീരം. ഞാൻ കൈ അല്ലാത്തതിനാൽ ശരീരത്തിന്റെ ഭാഗമല്ല എന്നു കാൽ പറഞ്ഞാൽ അതു ശരീരത്തിന്റെ ഭാഗമല്ലെന്നുവരുമോ? അതുപോലെതന്നെ, ഞാൻ കണ്ണല്ലാത്തതിനാൽ ശരീരത്തിൻറെ ഭാഗമല്ല എന്നു ചെവി പറഞ്ഞാൽ അതു ശരീരത്തിന്റെ ഭാഗമല്ല എന്നു ചെവി ചറഞ്ഞാൽ അതു ശരീരത്തിന്റെ ഭാഗമല്ല എന്നു ചെവി മാത്രമായിരുന്നെങ്കിൽ ഘോണം സാധ്യമാകുന്നതെങ്ങനെ? ശരീരം ഒരു ചെവി മാത്രമായിരുന്നെങ്കിൽ ഘോണം സാധ്യമാകുന്നതെങ്ങനെ? എന്നാൽ, ദൈവം സ്വന്തം ഇഷ്ടമനുസരിച്ച് ഓരോ അവയവവും ശരീരത്തിൽ ക്രമപ്പെടുത്തിയിരിക്കുന്നു. എല്ലാംകൂടെ ഒരു അവയവമായിരുന്നെങ്കിൽ ശരീരം എവിടെയാകുമായിരുന്നു? ഇപ്പോഴാകട്ടെ പല അവയവങ്ങളും ഒരു ശരീരവുമാണുള്ളത്" (12,12-20).

സഭയെ മിശിഹായുടെ ശരീരമായി കാണുന്ന വചനഭാഗങ്ങൾ ഈ ലേഖന ത്തിന്റെ മുന്നദ്ധ്യായങ്ങളിൽത്തന്നെയുണ്ട്. ഉദാഹരണത്തിന്, "മിശിഹാ വിഭജിക്ക പ്പെട്ടിരിക്കുന്നുവോ?" (1,13), "നിങ്ങൾ ദൈവത്തിന്റെ ആലയമാണെന്നും ദൈവാ ത്മാവ് നിങ്ങളിൽ വസിക്കുന്നുവെന്നും നിങ്ങൾക്കറിഞ്ഞുകൂടേ" (3,16), "നിങ്ങളുടെ ശരീരങ്ങൾ മിശിഹായുടെ അവയവങ്ങളാണെന്ന് നിങ്ങൾക്കറിയില്ലേ? മിശിഹായുടെ അവയവങ്ങളാക്കാമോ?" (6,15), "അപ്പം ഒന്നേയുള്ളൂ. അതിനാൽ പലരായിരിക്കുന്ന നാം ഒരു ശരീരമാണ്" (10,17).

ശരീരം ഒന്നാണെങ്കിലും അത് ഒരു അവയവമല്ല. പലതു ചേർന്നതാണ്. ഇത്ത

രത്തിൽ ഏക ശരീരമായ സഭയിൽ വൈവിധ്യങ്ങൾ ഉണ്ടായേ തീരൂ. മാമോദീസാ സ്വീകരിച്ച് ഒരേ ആത്മാവിനെ പാനം ചെയ്താണ് സഭ മിശിഹായുടെ ശരീരമായി രൂപപ്പെട്ടത് (12,13). ഒരു അവയവമല്ല, പലതു ചേർന്നതാണ് ശരീരം എന്നതാണ് ഇവിടെ പ്രധാനം (12,14). സഭയ്ക്ക് അടിസ്ഥാനപരമായി ഒരുമയുണ്ട്. എന്നാൽ, അത് ഒറ്റ അവയവമായിരിക്കുന്നതിലല്ല, ഒരുമയിലായിരിക്കുക എന്നതിലാണ്. വൈവിധ്യങ്ങൾ ശരീരത്തിലെ ചില കൂട്ടിച്ചേർക്കലുകളല്ല. അവ ശരീരത്തിന്റെ ഭാഗംത ന്നെയാണ്. ഓരോ അവയവത്തിനും ശരീരത്തിൽ നല്കപ്പെട്ട ദൗത്യങ്ങൾ നിർവ ഹിക്കാനുള്ളതുപോലെ, സഭയാകുന്ന ശരീരത്തിലും വിവിധ അംഗങ്ങൾക്ക് വിവിധ ദൗത്യങ്ങൾ നല്കപ്പെട്ടിരിക്കുന്നു. ഓരോ അംഗവും അതിന് ഏല്പിക്കപ്പെട്ടിരിക്കുന്ന ദൗത്യം നിർവഹിക്കണം. അപ്പോഴാണ് ശരീരത്തിന്റെ ഒരുമ യാഥാർത്ഥ്യമാ കുന്നത്. ഈ യാഥാർത്ഥ്യം അജപാലകർ അജഗണങ്ങൾക്ക് മനസ്സിലാക്കി കൊടുക്കണം.

4. ഒരു ശരീരവും പല അവയവങ്ങളും

"കണ്ണിന് കൈയോട് എനിക്കു നിന്നെക്കൊണ്ട് ആവശ്യമില്ല എന്നോ, തലയ്ക്കു കാലിനോട് എനിക്കു നിന്നെക്കൊണ്ട് ഉപയോഗമില്ല എന്നോ പറയുക സാധ്യമല്ല. നേരേമറിച്ച്, ദുർബലങ്ങളെന്നു കരുതപ്പെടുന്ന അവയവങ്ങളാണ് കൂടുതൽ ആവശ്യമായിരിക്കുന്നത്. മാന്യങ്ങളല്ലെന്നു കരുതപ്പെടുന്ന അവയവങ്ങൾക്കു നമ്മൾ കൂടുതൽ മാന്യത കൽപിക്കുകയും, ഭംഗി കുറഞ്ഞവയെന്നു കരുതപ്പെടുന്നവയെ കൂടുതൽ അലങ്കരിക്കുകയും ചെയ്യുന്നു. ഭംഗിയുള്ള അവയവങ്ങൾക്ക് ഇവയൊന്നും ആവശ്യമില്ല. ദൈവമാകട്ടെ, അപ്രധാനങ്ങളായ അവയവങ്ങൾക്കു കൂടുതൽ പ്രാധാന്യം ലഭിക്കത്തക്കവിധം ശരീരം സംവിധാനം ചെയ്തിരിക്കുന്നു. അതു ശരീരത്തിൽ പരസ്പരം ഭിന്നിപ്പുണ്ടാകാതെ അവയവങ്ങൾ തുലൃശദ്ധയോടെ വർത്തിക്കേണ്ടതിനുതന്നെ. ഒരു അവയവം വേദനയനുഭവിക്കുമ്പോൾ എല്ലാ അവയവങ്ങളും വേദനയനുഭവിക്കുന്നു. ഒരു അവയവം പ്രശംസിക്കപ്പെടുമ്പോൾ എല്ലാ അവയവങ്ങളും സന്തോഷിക്കുന്നു" (12,21-26).

സഭയെക്കുറിച്ച് ശ്ലീഹാ നല്കുന്ന വിശദീകരണത്തിൽ സഭാശരീരത്തിൽ സംഭവി ച്ചേക്കാവുന്ന രണ്ടുതരം മനോഭാവങ്ങളെ അവതരിപ്പിക്കുന്നു. ആദ്യത്തേത്, ചില അംഗ ങ്ങൾ തങ്ങൾക്കു മെച്ചമായ ധർമ്മങ്ങൾ ഇല്ലാത്തതിനാൽ തങ്ങൾ ശരീരത്തിൽ അവമതി ക്കപ്പെടുന്നു എന്നു കരുതുന്നതാണ്; തനിക്കു പ്രധാന ദാനങ്ങളില്ലാത്തതിനാൽ താൻ സമൂഹത്തിൽ ഒന്നുമല്ല എന്നു കരുതുന്നതാണ്. 'ഞാൻ കൈയ്യല്ലാത്തതുകൊണ്ട് ശരീര ത്തിന്റെ ഭാഗമല്ല' എന്നു കാൽ പറയുന്നതുപോലെയാണത്. രണ്ടാമത്തെ മനോഭാവം മെച്ചമായ ദൗത്യങ്ങൾ ഉള്ളവർ അത്രയും വലിയ ദൗത്യങ്ങളില്ലാത്തവരെ തള്ളിപ്പറയുന്ന താണ്; "എനിക്കു നിന്നെക്കൊണ്ട് ആവശ്യമില്ല" എന്ന വിധത്തിലുള്ള ചിന്തയാണ്. ഇതു രണ്ടും കോറിന്തോസിലെ സഭയിൽ പ്രബലമായിരുന്നു എന്നുവേണം കരുതുവാൻ. ഇതു രണ്ടിനെയും പൗലോസ്ശ്ലീഹാ തള്ളിപ്പറയുകയാണ്.

ശരീരത്തിലെ ഓരോ അവയവത്തിനും അതാതിന്റെ ധർമ്മം നല്കി ക്രമീകരിച്ചിരി ക്കുന്നത് ദൈവപദ്ധതിയാണ്. ദൈവം തന്റെ അഭീഷ്ടമനുസരിച്ചാണ് ഓരോരുത്തർക്കും പ്രത്യേക ദാനങ്ങൾ നല്കുന്നത്. ഇവിടെ ദൗത്യങ്ങൾ പലതാണെങ്കിലും അതിന് ആനു പാതികമായല്ല പ്രാധാന്യം കണക്കാക്കിയിരിക്കുന്നത്. പലപ്പോഴും ദുർബലങ്ങളെന്നു കരു തപ്പെടുന്ന അവയവങ്ങളാണ് കൂടുതൽ ആവശ്യകമായിരിക്കുന്നത് (12,22). "അപ്രധാനമായ അവയവങ്ങൾക്ക് കൂടുതൽ പ്രാധാന്യം ലഭിക്കത്തക്കവിധം ദൈവം ശരീരം സംവിധാനം ചെയ്തിരിക്കുന്നു" (12,23). അതുകൊണ്ട് സഭാംഗങ്ങൾ സഭയിലെ ഓരോരുത്തരുടെയും ആതമീയദാനങ്ങളെ തിരിച്ചറിയുകയും വിലമതിക്കുകയും ചെയ്യണം. ഇപ്രകാരം അജഗണ ങ്ങളെ ബോധവൽക്കരിക്കുവാൻ അജപാലകർ പ്രത്യേകം ശ്രദ്ധിക്കണം.

"നിങ്ങൾ മിശിഹായുടെ ശരീരവും ഓരോരുത്തരും അതിലെ അവയവങ്ങളുമാണ്. ഒൈവം സഭയിൽ ഒന്നാമത് ശ്ലീഹന്മാരെയും രണ്ടാമത് പ്രവാചകന്മാരെയും, മൂന്നാമത് പ്രബോധകരെയും, തുടർന്ന് അദ്ഭുതപ്രവർത്തകർ, രോഗശാന്തി നൽകുന്നവർ, സഹായകർ, ഭരണകർത്താക്കൾ, വിവിധ ഭാഷകളിൽ സംസാരിക്കുന്നവർ എന്നിവരെയും നിയമിച്ചിരിക്കുന്നു. എല്ലാവരും ശ്ലീഹന്മാരോ? എല്ലാവരും പ്രവാചകരോ? എല്ലാവരും പ്രബോധകരോ? എല്ലാവരും അദ്ഭുതപ്രവർത്തകരോ? എല്ലാവർക്കും രോഗശാന്തിക്കുള്ള വരങ്ങളുണ്ടോ? എല്ലാവരും വിവിധ ഭാഷകളിൽ സംസാരിക്കുന്നുണ്ടോ? എല്ലാവരും വ്യാഖ്യാനിക്കുന്നുണ്ടോ? എന്നാൽ, ഉത്കൃഷ്ടദാനങ്ങൾക്കുവേണ്ടി തീക്ഷ്ണമായി അഭിലഷിക്കുവിൻ. ഉത്തമമായ മാർഗം ഞാൻ നിങ്ങൾക്കു കാണിച്ചുതരാം" (12,27-31).

സഭയാണ് മിശിഹായുടെ ശരീരം. ഈ ശരീരം എല്ലാ അവയവങ്ങളും ചേർന്ന താണ്. അവയവങ്ങളെ ശരീരത്തിൽനിന്ന് വേർതിരിച്ചല്ല കാണുന്നത്. ശരീരത്തിലെ അവയവങ്ങളുടെ ധർമ്മമാണ് വിഭിന്നമായുള്ളത്. വിഭിന്നമായ ധർമ്മമുള്ളത് ശരീര ത്തിന്റെ പൂർണതയാണ്. ശരീരം യഥാവിധി പ്രവർത്തിക്കുന്നതിന്റെ അടയാളമാണ്. "നിങ്ങൾ ഓരോരുത്തരും" അതിലെ അവയവങ്ങളാണ് എന്നതു പ്രധാനമാണ്. കൂട്ടായ ക്രമീകരണമല്ല, ഓരോ വ്യക്തിയെ സംബന്ധിച്ചും ദൈവത്തിനുള്ള നിയതമായ പദ്ധ തിയാണ് ഇവിടെ ഉദ്ദേശിച്ചിട്ടുള്ളത്. അടുത്ത വാകൃത്തിൽ (12,28) വ്യക്തമാക്കുന്ന തുപോലെ, ഓരോരുത്തരെയും ദൈവം ചില ദൗത്യങ്ങൾ ഏല്പിച്ചിരിക്കുന്നു. ദൗത്യങ്ങളുടെ വൈവിധ്യമാണ് ഏകമായിരിക്കുന്ന ശരീരത്തിന് പൂർണത നല്കുന്നത്.

ഈ വസ്തുത വ്യക്തമാക്കിയതിനുശേഷം വിവിധ ദാനങ്ങളുടെ പട്ടിക അവത രിപ്പിക്കുന്നു. സഭാശരീരത്തിലെ ധർമ്മങ്ങളുടെ വൈവിധ്യത്തിനു കാരണം ദൈവ മാണ് എന്ന് ഊന്നിപ്പറഞ്ഞുകൊണ്ടാണ് വിവിധ ദാനങ്ങളുടെ പട്ടിക അവതരിപ്പിക്കുന്നത്. ആദ്യത്തെ മൂന്നെണ്ണം, അതായത്, ശ്ലീഹന്മാർ, പ്രവാചകന്മാർ, പ്രബോധകർ എന്നിവരെ പ്രധാനക്രമത്തിൽ പറഞ്ഞിരിക്കുന്നു. ഇവ മൂന്നും വചനശുശ്രൂഷയോടു ബന്ധപ്പെട്ടവയാണ്. ആദ്യമായി വരുന്നത് ശ്ലീഹന്മാരാണ്. സുവിശേഷപ്രഘോഷണം വിവിധ സ്ഥലങ്ങളിൽ നടത്തുകയും, സഭാസമൂഹങ്ങൾ സ്ഥാപിക്കുകയും, തങ്ങളുടെ ജീവിതങ്ങളിലൂടെ കർത്താവിന്റെ മരണോത്ഥാനങ്ങളെ വെളിപ്പെടുത്തുകയും ചെയ്യു ന്നവരാണവർ. രണ്ടാമതായി കാണുന്നത് പ്രവാചകന്മാരെയാണ്. ആരാധനാവേളക ളിൽ സഹോദരവിശ്വാസികളോടു സംസാരിച്ച് അവർക്കു പ്രചോദനം നല്കുന്നവ രാണിവർ. മൂന്നാമതായി വരുന്നത് പ്രബോധകരാണ്. വിശ്വാസികളെ സുവിശേഷ

ത്തിന്റെയും പഴയനിയമഗ്രന്ഥങ്ങളുടെയും അർത്ഥം പഠിപ്പിക്കുക എന്നതായിരുന്നു അവരുടെ ധർമ്മം. ഭാഷാവരത്തിന് ഏറ്റവും അവസാനത്തെ സ്ഥാനമാണ് നല്കിയി രിക്കുന്നത് എന്നതും ശ്രദ്ധേയമാണ്. സഭയിൽ ദൈവം നല്കുന്ന വരങ്ങളെക്കുറിച്ച് അജപാലകർക്ക് വ്യക്തമായ ധാരണയുണ്ടായിരിക്കണം.



New Parish Council and Trustees



and the new members of the council, appreciated the services of the current team and the meeting ended up with a thanksgiving lunch.


Prayerful Birthday wishes to Fr. Baiju Chakkery

On April 3 rd Canada nurses ministry selected fr. Joyal Joseph as an associate Director .on April 8 th we held a weekly zoom prayer




